Per Capita . . . What's that?

The concept of a *per capita* assessment may be new to you if your history has been in a different denomination.

The *per capita* assessment for 2016 is \$29.89 per member. (We invite you to round up to \$30.00.) You will find a blue *per capita* envelope in your box of giving envelopes. The money is apportioned to support the work of the larger church:

General Assembly PC(USA) \$7.12 (increased .05 from 2015)

Synod of the Pacific \$5.22 (unchanged from 2014/15)

Presbytery of the Cascades \$17.55 (increased 1.88 from 2015)

Total \$29.89

Each governing body above the Session has staff members and expenses that support the work of the whole church. Unlike pastors, these individuals have no congregation to support their ministry. Although their ministry may not be as "glamorous" as missionary work or pastoring a congregation, they are essential to the life of the Presbyterian Church. These are the people who prepare educational curriculum, the offering materials that we receive, and countless other resources.

When *per capita* supports the "overhead," then most of the contributions to mission and outreach can go directly to the stated purpose.

Becoming Your Authentic Self (Part #4)

Last month, I mentioned the importance of acknowledging in yourself those qualities you recognize in others. What we do with such recognition/acknowledgment—especially of undesired qualities—is crucial in becoming our authentic selves.

Some people are hiders. They try to hide those undesirable qualities from everyone—including themselves—by pretending that they do not possess these qualities. This approach is natural, but ultimately fails due to the toll it takes on the hider. This toll consists of the convolutions/contortions of spirit which the hider creates within her/himself in her/his efforts to hide these qualities. This approach results in an unauthentic self, marked by the *ignoring* of its undesired qualities.

Others are explainers. They try to "explain these undesired qualities away" to others as well as to themselves. Like hiding, this approach is natural but ultimately fails. The hazards of this approach for the explainer occur in two forms of postponement: 1) "kicking the can down the road" (directly delaying confronting these qualities), and 2) blaming others or circumstances for them (indirectly delaying their confrontation). This approach results in an unauthentic self marked by *discarding* its undesired qualities.

Still others are adapters. They accept these qualities in themselves, confront them, and make changes in themselves accordingly. Of the three approaches, adapting is the most difficult, but in my opinion offers the best results. First, the hazards to the adapter consist primarily in mobilizing her/himself for accomplishing changes in her/his attitude needed to successfully confront these qualities. Secondly, this approach leads to a self marked by an accounting for *all*—not just some—of its qualities. This is indeed an authentic self.

Whether we're hiders, explainers, or adapters, Jesus calls all of us to change our attitudes about ourselves, about others, and about God. He does this by shining a Light in our darkness. We may not welcome this Light like we welcomed the Babe of Bethlehem. At times we may not even recognize it. But our present and future depend on it. This Light paves the way for our change of attitude by creating a space for recognition. Some call this space "the ah ha moment". You may know it better as Epiphany.
