

Flickers from the Flame Jon Nestor Still Trying to Connect

Recently I received a telephone call from a company whose automated telephone system promptly announced, "Please hold!" Throughout the time I was on hold, about every thirty seconds that company's automated response system chimed in with, "Still trying to connect". I hung up after several minutes of this. I was appalled that a business would actually conduct its communication in this manner.

Once my frustration faded, I began to reflect on this experience. I invite you to reflect on it with me from two perspectives. The first perspective I will call ours, and give it the name, "unanswered Prayer". Prayer can take many forms, one of which is Petition. In this form of prayer, we ask (or petition) God to intervene in our earthly lives in a variety of ways. Sometimes we ask God to intervene in our own lives: at other times, we ask God to intervene in the lives of others. These latter may be people we are familiar with, people who are suffering but whom we do not know at all, etc. The point is, we want something to occur in these (or our own) lives that appears outside of our control.

We then begin to wait for an answer to our prayers. Sometimes it takes a long time for us to perceive that God is actively answering these prayers. If the time becomes long enough, we may begin to wonder whether God has even heard our prayers. Under these conditions, we may try to pray the same prayers again. As we do this, we essentially have the attitude, "Still Trying to Connect".

The second perspective I will call God's, and give it the name, "How long, O People". In the course of our dialogue with God, God may be trying to communicate a response to us that we either can't hear or don't hear for various reasons. At such times, God keeps trying to communicate with us, but can't quite get through. Yet God keeps trying to reach us. In these efforts, I can imagine God saying, "Still Trying to Connect".

During our earthly lives, we experience both perspectives. When was the most recent time you experienced each?



The Calling of Pastor Bob

During the past two years, Pastor Bob Barrett has worked hard to serve the needs of our congregation and to re-energize our church, along with reaching out to care for those in the larger Yachats Community.

Through Bob Barrett's efforts... we are opening our Fellowship Hall in September to host a home school educational program four days a week for local students; we will provide a Wednesday afternoon social gathering opportunity for children; and on Sunday, July 31, we began an additional Sunday evening contemporary service for those in the Yachats Community who may be open to a different style of music and worship service.

We value and need the continued caring leadership of Bob Barrett as we move the church forward into the future. In recognition of Pastor Bob's work and leadership, the Church Session has voted to issue a Call to Bob Barrett as our Full-Time Permanent Pastor (his present two-year contract as our Designated Pastor expires this fall).

On Sunday, August 21, 2016, we will be holding a Congregational Meeting right after the church service to honor Pastor Bob Barrett for his dedicated service, and to issue a formal Ministerial Call to him as our Permanent Solo Pastor, which will then be introduced for a vote of the church membership, along with the approval of his present Terms of Call.
