A Time of Centering

Life and Input come at us with ever-increasing speed . . . in overwhelming and unmanageable amounts. Images can so convincingly be contrived and manipulated. "Fact-checking" is now a multi-million dollar industry (and who "fact-checks" the fact-checkers?). Mathematical algorithms gather, arrange and filter the data that comes <u>our</u> way, according to someone else's motives, agendas and interests . . . someone who wants us to <u>buy</u> certain things, think certain thoughts, take certain actions. The uncertainties of Life that keep it an adventure are used to engender ill-ease and confusion.

Life's wonderful variety gets distorted into rationales for fear, suspicion, weaponizing our homes . . . for demeaning and even hating "the other."

Differing opinion gets re-cast as opposition and polarization an <u>end</u> to conversation and understanding, <u>not</u> the <u>beginning</u>; what <u>divides</u> rather than what brings us <u>together</u>.

Come, let's reason together, to keep Life its healthiest, kindest, and best. Let's worship together.
