## Elaine Harley Named Elder Emerita

On Sunday, January 13, Elaine Harley was honored as Elder Emerita of YCPC. The following information about Elaine and her contributions to the life and ministries of YCPC was included in the bulletin.

## You could always count on Elaine.

(DJ Novgrod, Elder)
According to the Church Register, Elaine Harley was officially received as a member 55 years and nine months ago on April 7, 1963 (Palm Sunday).
At that time, the congregation worshiped at the Little Log Church and its name was The Little Log Church of Yachats. Elaine became a member before the congregation became "Yachats Community Presbyterian Church" . . . likely before building this church was even discussed at session meetings . . . before the agate windows . . . before the Yachats Music Festival . . . before many other activities in the life of YCPC.
Elaine served as YCPC's Parish Nurse for so long (1999-2014) that many may not be aware of her service as an elder. And while Elaine's service as Parish Nurse emphasized her concern and work for the well being of body, mind and soul, her service as an elder required attention to administrative and many other details of congregational life.

Elaine was first elected as an elder in January of 1971 to fill an expired term of one year (1971-1972). She was ordained the following Sunday, January 24, and elected by the session three days later to serve as clerk-not a minor role and no small task. At 38, Elaine was the youngest elder on the session; her daughter, Kristie, was 14 , and her son, Steve, was 10.

She was re-elected in 1972 and continued to serve as clerk of session for the next three years.
Over a period of 39 years, Elaine served 11 years as elder-three 3 -year terms and two years to fill unexpired terms. Her last term as an elder was 2008-2010.

In addition to serving as clerk of session for four consecutive years, Elaine's service as elder included:

- Delegate to Presbytery
- Chair or Member of the following regular committees: Christian Education, Worship, Nominating, and Personnel. She was also on the Pastor Nominating Committee that recommended John Waide.
- Elaine was most often on the Christian Education Committee when it planned not only church school lessons but also activities for junior high and high school kids including: ski trips, summer camps, fundraisers for camps, and vacation Bible school.

In addition to her service as an elder and parish nurse, Elaine was elected and ordained as a deacon last year.

## Indeed, you could and still can always count on Elaine.

Note . . . Elaine was first invited to church by her best friend, Doris (Canfield) Gardenhire, when they were in Waldport High School.
