
Sunday, August 18, Earth Care Workshop

Temptation in the Lord's Prayer

When you were first learning to pray, who taught you how to do it? Your mom? Your dad? One of your siblings? Some other relative? A friend? When the disciples were learning to pray, Jesus was their teacher. In the New Testament, the prayer Jesus taught his disciples (known as the Lord's Prayer) appears in two different locations (Matthew 6:9 – 13 and Luke 11:2 - 4). While Luke's version is somewhat shorter and slightly different than Matthew's, these two versions are essentially identical.

Arguably, the most controversial line in the Lord's Prayer is Matthew 6:13; Luke 11:4b). "Lead us not into temptation, ..." Temptation, by definition, is the human state of vulnerability in which we are susceptible to evil and/or its effects. Temptation is dangerous. It is harmful to us, and exerts a powerful grip on us. We are not humanly capable of removing ourselves from temptation. On the one hand, you might understandably ask, "Why would God ever lead us into temptation?" Regarding this question, some of you might answer, "To test our faithfulness." While there may be times and circumstances in which God is interested in how faithful we are, I think that God has other ways to test our faithfulness rather than to place – let alone lead - us into temptation.

I've noticed that when we say the Lord's Prayer in our worship services, these days, we say, "Let us not fall into temptation." While this represents an improvement on the supposition that God would ever lead us into temptation, our human condition places us frequently in a state of temptation, whether we realize it or not. Thus, when we are in a state of temptation, this is not God's fault. Rather, it is our human nature to find ourselves in various states of temptation. Therefore, I think an even better improvement on what we are now saying is, "Leave us not in a state of temptation." Just as God's nature is to "deliver us from evil", God never intended us to be (and does not want us to remain) in *any* state of temptation.

What recommendations would you offer on the portion of the Lord's Prayer regarding temptation?
