The music will be provided by Yachats Big Band, Jim and Shirley O'Brien, Music on the Road, Robert Rubin, and The Sauerkraut Seven.

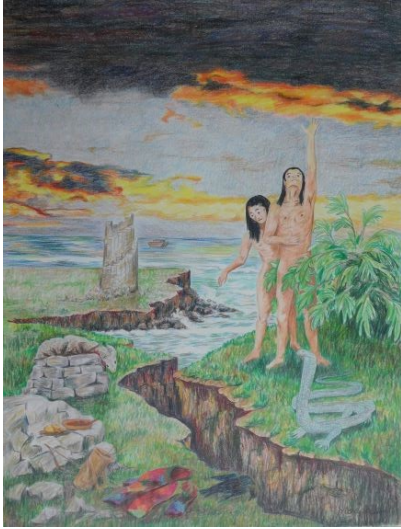
The Beer will be from Yachats Brewing.

Anglo Saxon Colored Pencil Folk Art Bible by Maeona Urban

Folk Art Bible in 40 Posters

You are invited to view a total of 40 drawings by well-known artist Maeona L. Urban. For each book of the Old Testament (two for Psalms) the artist has drawn her ideas about it in colored pencil on a large poster. These posters have been created over a period of 35 to 40 years.

The project began as charts during a personal study in the mid to late 70s. These charts are now affixed to the back of each poster and were followed in deciding the visual concepts to use in depicting each book of the Bible.

This artwork may not meet some common theological ideas because they are pictures of what Maeona thought about rather than beliefs taught by a church.

The unique posters include such images as: a serpent with legs, 150 different hands representing Psalms, Job's wife shaking her finger at him, figures resembling men with four faces, wings, and calf feet, along with visions and prophecies.

Maeona grew up in a Caucasian neighborhood. The medium is colored pencil and the style is more of a folk art one as opposed to the more fine art style she uses in her other artwork. She combined items and scenes of modern and Biblical times and felt the term "Folk Art" best fit this style, thus the title of the project: "Anglo Saxon Colored Pencil Folk Art Bible".

Maeona will be present to talk with you about the pictures and will be happy to answer questions.
